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Charity Purpose:

Foundation for Slum Child care aims to develop disadvantaged children's lives quality by strengthening their families and develop the family efficiency, providing technical service to care for young children, extending the foundation working network to all region across the country as well as being a significant part of driving the policy, law, welfare and child development support broadly.

Every activities projects of foundation for Slum Child Care focuses on disadvantaged children age 0-5 year to enable them obtaining a good beginning since their are young.

The charitable activity projects of the foundation mainly focuses on the categories below:

- Providing help to disadvantaged children, children in the risk age between 0-5 years.
- Family institution
- Community

Foundation for Slum Child Care was awarded by Thailand NGO Awards 2013 from the Rockefeller Foundation, The Resource Alliance, and Kenan Foundation Asia.

The donation to Foundation for Slum Child Care is entitled to be tax deductible in line with the Ministry of Finance Declaration number 208.

Review Process:

Mr. Manu Pensawangwat, a GBA's representative visited Foundation for Slum Child Care's office located in soi Suayai Pracha-Utit, Rachadapisek 36 on May 2nd, 2016 and met Ms. Sillada Rangsigunom, the Manager of the foundation and her management team.

Ms. Sillada narrated the charitable activities projects of the foundation and presented the foundation's annual report with audited financial statement for the year 2015 which was audited by Mrs Parichart Porakontum, auditor license number 9849 on behalf of Pplus Auditing Co., Ltd.

Background:

1968 "The One Baht a day School" was initiated in the Klongtoey slum community by Kru. Prateep Ungsongtham, who the then was 16 years old in order to open an opportunity to less opportunity children living in the area to have a place taking care them properly while they parents made a living during the day time.

As a teacher concerned with the children welfare, Kru Prateep Ungsongtham became more involved in the problems of her community, and came to be a community's representative and spokesperson when dealing with local authorities.

1981 Kru Prateep Ungsongtham was recognized nationally and internationally, she was awarded by John D. Rockefeller for Youth Award for Outstanding Contribution Mankind.

1981, with the fund from the Rockefeller award including the support of other co-founders, the Foundation for Slum Child Care Center was established with its aims to providing baby and children welfare and facilities services for those disadvantaged living in the slum communities.

Description of Activities:

In the year 2015, the foundation worked with its target groups totally 7,788 persons consisting of

- new-born babies and children age 0-5 years amounted 4,602 children.
- Children reunion with families 453 children
- Pregnant women who experience problems 88 women
- 157 teachers and nannies in its own child care centers
- 1,120 teacher and nannies from government agencies and private sectors.

In addition to conducting training courses in various topics related to taking care children and being lecturer for external organizations.

The Foundation for Slum Child Care worked with its target groups:

1. Group of babies and children age 0 - 5 years by the services provided as below:

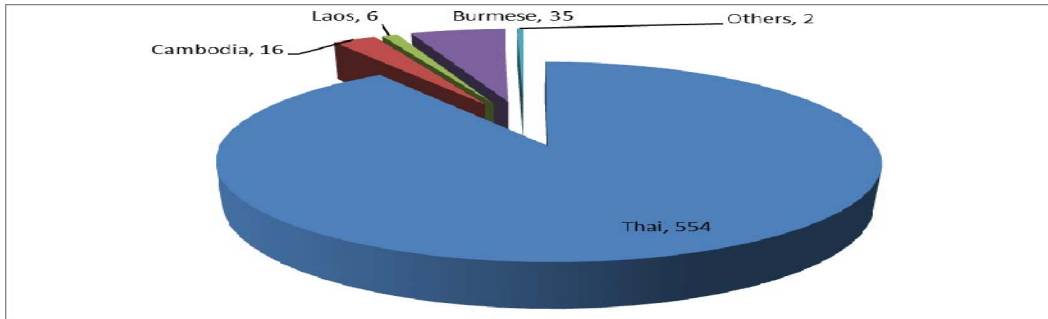
Day Care Centers

The Foundation operates 4 mains Day Care Centers locating in slum communities in Bangkok:

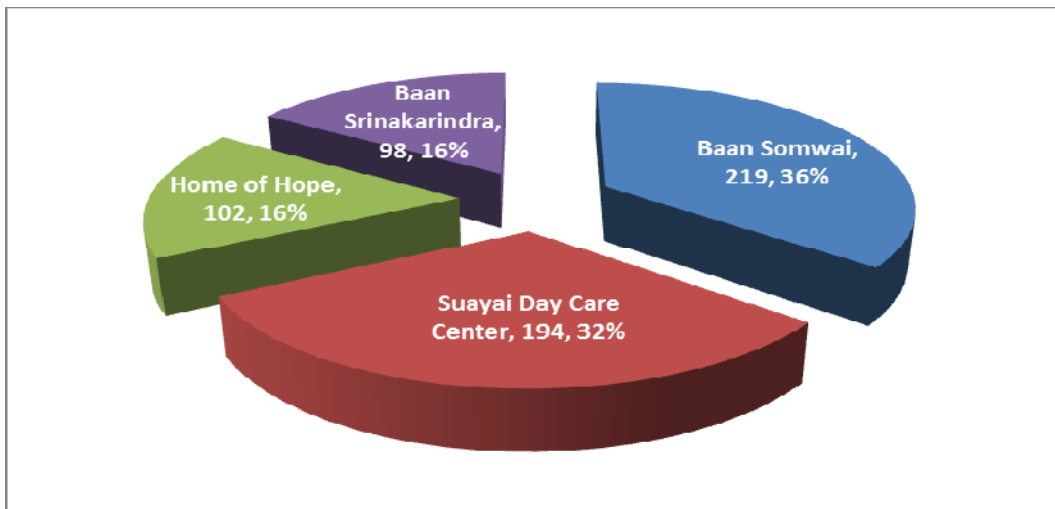
- **Baan Somwai Day Care Center** located in Klong Toey Slum Community taking care 219 disadvantaged and at risk babies and children age between 3 months to 5 years old.
- **Baan Dek Onn (Nursery Home) Suayai Day Care Center** for 194 less opportunity and at risk babies with children age between 1.5 to 5 years who live in the slum nearby.
- **Home of Hope (On-nuj Day Care Center)** for 102 babies and children living in poverty in the garbage dump community in soi On-nuj 84.
- **Baan Srinakarindra (Srinakarindra Day Care Center)** for 98 less opportunity babies and children living with the poor families in the area of Petkasem garbage dump community, Petkasem soi 104.

In 2015, the four Day Care Centers took care totally 613 less opportunity babies and children.

Joint development with Private Day Care Center in Slum Community Project.

In 2015, the foundation joined with private Day Care Centers in various slum communities across Bangkok area to conduct training course for nannies, to network together, and developing their knowledge on how to taking care babies and children properly. There was a significant improvement on the collaboration of each Day Care Center which their services provided to totally 3,784 children living in over 62 slum communities Bangkok-wide with the assessment scheme from the foundation.

Children in crisis

In 2015, the foundation dealt with 131 babies and children in crisis whose parents were unable to look after them due to being prison, drug addicted, abandoned by teenager moms etc. The foundation collaborated with private children's home which belongs to a Christian community in Prae province and transferred them to be under the care of the children's home.

Powder milk provision to babies in slum communities.

In 2015, 74 babies living with poverty in various communities were provided powder milk by the foundation from its milk fund.

2. Children reunion with their own families

There were 453 children who with help by the foundation to reunite with their own families in 2015.

3. Parental meeting

The foundation regularly conducted parental meeting both individual basis by visiting them at their own residence and on a group basis in order to explore any problems, giving advice and implementing preventive measures from any matter which shall impact to their children. In 2015, there were totally 982 parents who participated with the meeting. The foundation also organized joint activities between children and their families to build a strong relationship among them.

4. Pregnant women who experience problems

In 2015, there were 246 pregnant women who obtained consultancy services from each center of the foundation which included self-preparation, medical checking services, and find the solution to solve the individual problems.

5. Nanny and teacher working with private Day Care Center in slum communities

There were 1,120 nannies and teachers from the private Day care Center in slum communities who received training courses to be good nanny and teacher for children, babies and child behaviour course etc. Foundation for Slum Child Care also created the network among the trainees in order to implement a good standard practice of nanny and children's teacher with the parental connection to follow-up children development progress, and implement preventive measure for the children from risk surrounded in the communities.

6. Conducting various training courses and workshops

Foundation for Slum Child Care is one of charitable organization that has been accepted and accredited on its quality of training courses which specifically focus on taking care babies and children country-wide.

There were many private Day Care Centers, schools from other provinces that sent their personnel who work in child care to obtain training courses from the foundation.

At Baan Dek Onn (Suayai Pracha-Utit Day Care Center) has accommodation service facilities providing up to 50 trainees with the training room.

In 2015, the foundation organized and conducted 3 main training courses and workshops with the total 725 participants detail following:

Achievement

The foundation was able to extend the network of participants in the training courses and workshops, to children's teachers from up-country schools and private Day Care centers covering 61 provinces nation-wide. As for those teachers who obtained the good teacher leader in children mind course, most were able to organize training courses and workshops in their own areas which also helped the foundation extend its knowledge base more widely.

7. Being invited as lecturer to other organizations

The foundation's lecturers were invited by National Institute of Development Administration (NIDA) "Transparency Organization in Thailand" which is a part of Thailand Development Research institute (TDRI) to lecture on the topic, "Grow without Cheating". There were 364 participants in 2015. The foundation was invited to lecture on the topic of "Child Development Promotion" by the local administration of Samutprakarn City. There were 31 participants who mostly work with over 21,230 children in the province.

8. Volunteers

Foundation for Slum Child Care has initiated its own volunteering to work within slum communities, the foundation classified its own volunteer into three categories detail following:

- **Leader Volunteer**, the Leader Volunteers work within each slum community as agents of the foundation to deal with local authorities, coordinate with the communities. Mostly, the Leader Volunteers are aged above 18 to 60 years. There are 15 Leader Volunteers working for the foundation without receiving any compensation.
- **Young Leader Volunteers**, 19 Young Leader Volunteers were selected from Day Care Centres of the foundation to be eyes of the foundation within the communities that they live to prevent any risk and harassment to other children in their communities.
- **Young Volunteers**, 352 children were selected from each Day Care Center of the foundation to assist the Young Leader Volunteers on preventive action as an alarm in their communities.

In 2015, Foundation for Slum Child Care operated its activities and projects in 108 communities:

Transparency and reporting

Foundation for Slum Child Care presented its Annual Operation Report for the year 2015 in booklet format, however, the report didn't publish on its website www.fscc.or.th . The foundation also presented its audited annual financial statement in the same year which was audited by Mrs. Parichart Porkonthum, auditor license number 9849 of Pplus Auditing Co., Ltd.

From the foundation's financial statement year 2015, GBA found that its Overhead expenses were 14% of its income generated in the year which was considered reasonably low considering the scope of charitable activities and projects.
