Summary

HHN Foundation Thailand has established Drop-in Center in year 2010 to provide shelter and primary care to children who need help. Drop-in Center is located in central of Pattaya City which is convenience and accessible for children who need food, consultation and safe shelter. Drop-in center can immediately provide basic necessary things such as food, shelter, clothes and medicine (not less than minimum standard of Ministry of Social Development and Human Security year 2006). Additionally, there are consultation services or rehabilitation for children who need to be protected according to The


Child Protection Act such as children who used to be in human trafficking, violence against children and children who are vulnerable to misconduct. For consulting process, Drop-in center works together with children and family together with persons in many professions in order to plan and determine guideline for problem solving. Family and



children will participate in all decision making process under guideline and method of social work profession such as The UN Convention on children's rights, The Child Protection Act. 2013, Domestic Violence Protection Act 2007, Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act 2011 and related laws, giving priority to maximum children's benefit.

In 2014, United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) and Japan Embassy of Thailand sponsored mobile car or Mobile Training Unit to support field work in various areas under the name MTU (Mobile Training Unit) with objective as public relation media to create awareness to children and youth in many places such as construction site, congested area, school, public and private units that take care of children. MTU concentrates on activities for development of life skills, self-protection from being exploited in various ways, create awareness and understanding of family violence, and drug problem in order to enable children to live in society. During year 2014- 2016, nearly 5,000 children participated in activities of MTU.

From the field work during year 2014-2016, there were more than 2,000 transnational children and youth whose parents migrate to work in Pattaya City (Annual Report 2015-2016). Those children could not access to government services such as education, health care and nutrition which impact their quality of life and way of living.



HHN Foundation Thailand realizes that many problems have impact on children and youth therefore HHN set up an education center for transnational children called HHN Asean Education Center within Drop-in Center under financial support for the first year operation (2016) from German Embassy of Thailand and will receive financial support for the next 2 years (2017-2018) from Rotary Club of Eastern Seaboard and Rotary Club Dolphin Pattaya International. The education center will serve 80-100

transnational children of age 3-12 years. Objective is to promote education to children in mixed classes by teachers who pass training program in child development including Thai teacher, volunteer foreign teacher, Cambodia teacher and Myanmar teacher. Children will practice and develop



language skills, communication, life skills, and basic skills. Additionally, there are recreation activities that enable children to have good health, proper development and be able to apply those knowledge and skills as basic for further learning and living in the future. During January - June 2017, over 120 transnational children (in-out) came to study at Asean Education Center.

In 2017, field work team of HHN Foundation Thailand created a Child Protection Card Game having teachers of Faculty of Learning Science and Faculty of Education, Thammasat University, as advisors. The game is a simulation of situation in form of card game (simulation game) with the objective

to create self-awareness to children for protection of being tempted in various ways. We believe that the best way to protect children from being tempted is that children must have the idea and skills in evaluation of situation, decide and solve problem in critical situation by themselves. Such game



becomes master game in academic seminar on game and problem solving arranged by Thammasart University and Banpu Plc at Bangkok Art and Culture Center. There are more than 500 attendants of innovators, scholars, and students.

Moreover, HHN Foundation Thailand present the Mobile Training Unit project and Child Protection Card Game for the competition in Social Impact Awards 2017 organized by The Resource Alliance and was awarded as a Finalist Most Innovative Campaign. We are proud to that we are not only a problem solver for children but also work proactively to create knowledge and social innovation for protection of problem that may happen with children and youth.



Operating Objectives

1. To enable children and youth to have rights under The UN Convention on children's rights.

2. To protect, safeguard and help children in accordance with The Child Protection Act. 2013.

3. To proactively work in providing knowledge about children's rights, how to protect from abuse, drug problem, sexuality problem and children exploitation.

4. To promote and develop life skills and basic necessary skills for children to live happily in society.

Quantitative Objectives

1. To protect, safeguard and support children who need help according to The Child Protection Act 2013.

2. To provide education and promote hygiene for transnational children under HHN Asean Education Center.

3.To provide knowledge to children about protection from being tempted and life skills via MTU. Services area are 1) children and youth at congested community and construction site (70%), 2) children at Drop-in Center and at school (30%)

Qualitative Objectives

1. Every children and youth will obtain help and support at not less than minimum standard of The Child Protection Act.

2. 80% of children and youth have better life skills and basic necessary skills.

3.80% of children and youth know about children's rights, know how to protect from sexual harassment or exploitation in various ways.

4. 80% of children and youth know about drug problem, know how to deny and not to involve in drug.

Target Group are divided into 3 types

- Drop-in Center group, means children who deserved help and protection according to The Child Protection Act. 2013.
 - 1.1 Student stay at Drop-in center.
 - 1.2 Children under scholarship
 - 1.3 Children in community who receive help.
- Asean Education Center group, means transnational children in many construction sites who come to study at Asean Education Center of Drop-in Center during 08:00-16:00 hr.
- 3. Mobile Training Unit group (MTU)
 - 3.1 Children in community and construction sites. MTU continuously conducts activities every week by arranging integrated instructional approach and freestyle instructional approach on life skills and basic necessary skills for children.
 - 3.2 Children in foster houses and schools. MTU conducts monthly activities at 1-2 times depending on readiness of foster houses or schools. Concentrations are on children's right, sexuality study and life skills.
 - 3.3 Children in academy or school. MTU conducts activity for 1 time/school to do public relations of Mobile Training Unit project and to arrange activity on children's rights and sexuality.

Anticipated Outcome

- 1. Children and youth have rights under The UN Convention on children's rights.
- 2. Children are protected, guarded, and helped according to The Child Protection Act. 2013
- 3. Children have knowledge about children's rights, how to protect from abused, drug problem, sexuality problem, and seeking unfair benefit from children.
- 4. Children have life skills and basic necessary skills and can live happily in society.

1. Work of Drop-in Center for children and family

Main objective of Drop-in Center is to support children who need help according to The Child Protection Act. 2013 having status as the first place to temporary help children of not more than 90 days in order to search and analyze children and their families and to determine way of help and proper welfare protection in the future. Drop-in Center also help mother and child who encounter difficulties in their life and work together with community to enhance disadvantage people in community to be able to access to various public welfares. Moreover, Drop-in Center grants scholarship to children who have no money to obtain equal education opportunity.

During January – June 2017, Drop-in Center helped children, youth and no-status people totally more than 60 persons as follow:

1.1 Provide shelter Drop-in Center assists children who suffered difficulties in life to have safe shelter, good nutrition food and proper education. During January – June 1017, government and private

units such as foster house, police station, hospital and many foundations in Chonburi province sent totally 6 children to Drop-in Center under the following reasons 1. Broken family and children are in risky environment, a total of 4 persons 2. Sexual harassment by family member, a total of 2 persons.

Drop-in Center already provided primary assistance to all children and coordinated with for long-term protection.

1.2 Assist children and family. Drop-in Center realized that family is the most important thing in children's life. Taking children from their family will be the last decision. Therefore, Drop-in Center assists family of children to be self-reliance and be able to take care of children. Drop-in Center visits their houses to evaluate assistance to children and families. There are 3 types of assistances:

- Scholarship grants. Drop-in Center grants scholarship to students with moderate to good performance but stay in poor family. At present, Drop-in Center grants 1 -year scholarship to 6 students in elementary and secondary level of Baht 1,000 -1,500/month and 1 student in university level of Baht 2,000/month. Additionally, Drop-in Center grants 15





scholarships per year for Warm Family Project of YMCA Association, Pattaya Center, of Baht 30,000/year and annually grants 30 scholarships to students in congested community.

- Family grants. Short-term assistance within 1 year to family who face difficult life such as single parent, broken family, income less than expense, or having young baby. At present, Drop-in Center provides family grants to 5 families at Baht 1,500/family.

- Provide necessary consumer goods. To provide basic consumer goods for those who need immediate assistance such as people who just left prison, homeless people, jobless people, mothers who just gave birth and have no money to buy milk and diaper for baby. Drop-in Center grants consumer goods a total of 10 persons/month to initially relief their trouble.

1.3 Give advice and assist on personal documents. Those people who are in trouble could not obtain government services as they do not have documents to confirm their rights. Drop-in Center therefore provides advisory and coordination services to get many rights such as

- Process on identity card

- Help people who have no status
- Process on social security card

- Operate to obtain rights for various privileges such as senior allowances, disable allowance.

- Process to take children in congested community to school.

During January – June 2017, Drop-in Center worked on documentation of rights for over 15 children and families.



2. Asean Education Center Work



Situation on children and youth have always been changing especially in 2016 when Thailand become a member of Asean Economic Community causing migration of labor from neighboring countries of

Thailand. Pattaya is one of cities that these labors come to work for construction of building, condominium and others. These labors come together with family and children.

Under activities of MTU, there were more than 2,000 children of migrant workers (Annual Report 2015-2016) who could not access to education and public health services. Those children have to stay in construction sites or camps which are vulnerable to their safety particularly when their parents go out to work.

On June 16, 2016 HHN Foundation Thailand together with Rotary Club of Eastern Seaboard and Rotary Club Dolphin Pattaya International had a meeting to find development guideline for transnational children in Pattaya and establish an education center within Drop-in Center under the name of HHN Asean Education Center to provide education to transnational children in Pattaya City and nearby area. The education center can serve 80-100 children of ages 3-15 years. Children will study about basic skills, Thai, English, Myanmar and



Cambodia languages and also will develop mathematics and life skills. Children will have basic knowledge and be ready when they have to go back home to their own country.




Table 3: Statistic of children who attend services of Asean Education Center

According to above table, during January – June 2017 there were approximately 120 children (in and out) at Asean Education Center comprising Cambodia 65% and Myanmar 45%. Those children came from 5 labor camps including 21-rai Camp, AD Na Klua Camp, Home & Pool Camp, VKK Camp, and 1 scatter group.



Daily Activities

Asean Education Center takes care and safeguards children's welfare at day time. It is also a learning center for educational development for children to have proper development according at their age level and to have the ability to read-write and communicate. Asean Education Center promotes activities to develop life skills, to have immunity for life and to live happily in society. Teaching class is scheduled from Monday-Friday during 08:30-16:00.

Summary of Activities of Asean Education Center

Asean Education Center presently covers 4 main learning activities:

- 1. Activities for life skills development
- 2. Activities for basic skills development
- 3. Activities for moral and ethics development
- 4. Activities for health and recreation
- Activities for life skill development These activities will develop children to have necessary life skills which comprise 4 main elements: 1) Recognize and realize in value of themselves and others 2) Analyze, make decision and solve problem creatively 3) Emotion and stress management 4) Make good relationship with others (Core Curriculum Basic Education Office 2008) by applying life skill development process of Right to Play Foundation of Thailand with context of children in Asean Education Center.

 Activities for development of basic skills. These activities enhance children to read-write and communicate. Asean Education Center splits the learning class into Thai, English, Cambodia and Myanmar languages by having Thai teacher, Cambodia teacher, Myanmar teacher and foreign volunteers to teach children every day. Objective is to enable children to use proper language to communicate.

3. Activities for moral and ethics development are activities that enable children to be good children with virtue by using meditation for wisdom principles. After meal every day, children will have chance to meditate about 15-20 minutes per day. Children are also trained by specially trained teacher.

4. Activities to promote health and recreation are activities that enhance children to have good health. Asean Education Center provides monthly medical check-up by nurses and provide hygiene foods. Every child will have clean food and milk. The Center also provides area for children to express their capabilities such as singing, dancing and exercising. Thai and foreign guests regularly join those activities with children.

Additionally, the Center offers other services to children to enable them to learn continuously such as school uniform (3 sets per person), books, school bus service around many construction camps, annual medical check-up by professional officers and pediatricians from YWCA Association, computer room for searching information and developing language skills, and free hair cut from Juthamas Beauty School.

3.Mobile Training Unit / MTU (Outreach work)

Mobile Training Unit works proactively by joining activities with children in various areas such as construction sites, congested areas, schools and foster houses both public and private. All activities are organize to provide knowledge about life skills, children's right, how to protect themselves from sexual exploitation, family abuses, drug problem and sexual education. Children will have better living skills, realize about their rights and duties and be prevented from crime.

Project objectives are as follows:

1. To propagandize and public relations via MTU activities so that children and youth realize on education.

2. To proactively work in providing knowledge on children's right, protection from abuse, drug problem, sexual problem, and children exploitation.


3. To promote and develop life skills, basic necessary skills for children and youth.





Operation Procedure/Activities

Summary statistic of participants of MTU activities during January - June 2017

From above table, there are approximately 100-150 children participating in activity of MTU each month. Service area is divided into 3 groups as follows: 1) Construction camps which have 120 children of migrant workers from 6 camps 2) 150 Thai children in congested community and urban area 3) Children in foster house and school. There are about 300 children from 2 schools and 1 foster house. In summary, there are approximately 570 children participating in MTU activities.



1. Children in community and construction sites. MTU regularly conducts activities every week by arranging integrated freestyle instructional approach with concentrate on life skills and basic necessary skills for children. During January - June 2017, MTU provided education to children in 6 construction camps including Na-Klue Camp, Poseidon Camp, SK Camp, 21 -rai Camp and Syntec Camp. About 120 children participated in these activities.



2. Children in congested community. MTU works together with Social Development Office of Pattaya City for development of children's life in congested area in Pattaya City by arranging activity that provides knowledge about how to protect themselves from sexual harassment from close person and stranger. During January – June 2017, MTU performed activities in 9 communities comprising Kratinglai Community, Roilung Community, Laemrajchavej Community, Baankrabok Community, Chaipornvithee Community, Watchaimongkol Community, Bongkoj Community, Watthamsamakkee Community and Baan Nuenrodfai Community. Total approximately 150 children participated in these activities.





3. Children in foster houses and schools. MTU visits foster houses and schools every month as public relation and arranges activity to provide knowledge on children's rights and sexual education. These will enhance children to have knowledge on their rights, to protect violation of all types, and encourage children to ask for help when experiencing bad circumstance. In year 2016, MTU gave knowledge to children in 2 schools (Pattaya City School and Wat Boonsampun School) and 1 foster house (Baan Uea Aree Child Protection Center). Total approximately 300 students attend activities.

Summary of Activities of Drop-in Center/Asean Education Center

During January – June 2017
